**Progress report on the implementation  
of the Coffee Quality-Improvement  
Programme (CQP)  
October to June: 2005/06 to 2009/10**

## **Background**

1. Resolution 420 requests exporting Members to indicate in box 17 of all Certificates of Origin, on a voluntary basis, information on the quality of the coffee exported by defects and moisture content. This allows the monitoring of the level of compliance with the target standards based on the data received.
2. The information presented in this document is based on data received from Certificates of Origin (in electronic or paper format) issued to cover coffee exported in the period October to June: 2005/06 to 2009/10. It also contains information on progress in the implementation of the CQP in exporting Member countries since Resolution 420 came into effect. The previous report on the implementation of the CQP is contained in document EB-3970/10.

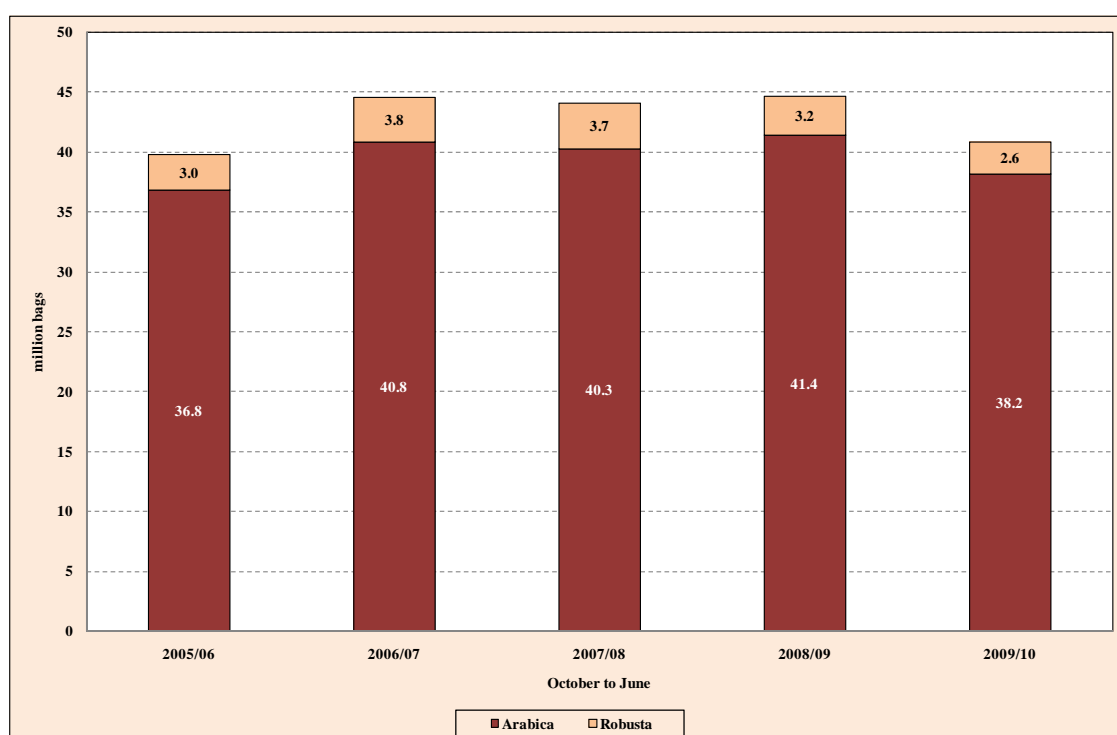

**PROGRESS REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE  
COFFEE QUALITY-IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (CQP)  
OCTOBER TO JUNE: 2005/06 TO 2009/10**

1. Since Resolution 420 came into effect in June 2004, 28 exporting Members have provided information on the quality of the coffee they export, through Certificates of Origin. From October 2009 to June 2010, these 28 exporting Members accounted for just under 69% of world exports in the period.

2. The total volume of green coffee exported by all exporting countries in the first nine months of coffee year 2009/10 amounted to 64.6 million bags. The total volume of green coffee exported by the 28 countries participating in the CQP amounted to 44.5 million bags. However, four Members have effectively failed to provide information on their exports from October 2009 to June 2010. Furthermore, it appears that only 12 Members of those participating in the CQP have provided complete data for this period. On the basis of the information extracted from Certificates of Origin, the volume of green coffee exported by the Members providing information regularly amounted to 40.8 million bags, of which 38.2 million bags (93.5%) were Arabica and 2.6 million bags were Robusta (6.5%).

3. Tables 1 and 2 show the volume of green coffee exported from October to June in the first nine months of each coffee year 2005/06 to 2009/10 by the exporting Members effectively participating in the CQP. These tables give the volume of green coffee classified in accordance with the parameters set out in Resolution 420 by origin and by type – Arabica and Robusta. The graph below shows the total volume of green coffee exported by the countries participating in the CQP from October to June 2005/06 to 2009/10.



4. The Organization will continue to monitor compliance with Resolution 420 by exporting Members.
