ICO Seminar on the Coffee Berry Borer

London, 17 March 2009

This presentation will emphasize findings on known and new natural enemies of CBB and cover certain aspects of basic biology of the pest such as predictions on the effects of global warming on the dynamics of the insect.

- Dr César Augusto Domingues Teixeira, Researcher, EMBRAPA, Brazil: This presentation will introduce results obtained from research into the control of the CBB in Robusta coffee.
- Dr Francisco Infante, Researcher, Department of Tropical Entomology, ECOSUR, Mexico: Latin American natural enemies of the coffee berry borer, with emphasis on the nematode *Metaparasitylenchus hypothenemi*.

Ever since the CBB was introduced to the American continent in the early 1900s, many predators and parasitoids of this pest have been discovered. Among these, the nematode *Metaparasitylenchus hypothenemi* could play an important role in regulating natural population levels of the CBB.
