**Compliance with the provision of
statistical data
Coffee years 2010/11 to 2016/17 and
October to December 2017**

Background

1. This document provides information on the compliance of Members with the Rules on Statistics approved by the Council which are contained in documents [ICC-102-9](#) – Certificates of Origin; and [ICC-102-10](#) – Statistical Reports.
2. The information contained herein covers compliance of Members for each coffee year from 2010/11 to 2016/17 and the first quarter of coffee year 2017/18. When analysing whether Members were in compliance with the Rules on Statistics, the Secretariat considered all the information received up to 16 March 2018. It should be noted that the report now includes all data required under the new Rules on Statistics as Members have had more than seven years to adjust to the new requirements.
3. Compliance by exporting Members in respect to the provision of timely statistics for all data required is summarized in Annexes 10 and 10A. Similarly, Annex 11 shows the compliance by importing Members.

Action

The Statistics Committee is requested to examine the compliance status of each Member of the Organization, in order to make appropriate recommendations to the Council.

**COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISION OF STATISTICAL DATA
COFFEE YEARS 2010/11 TO 2016/17 AND
OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2017**

Statistics provided by exporting Members

1. The Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) paragraphs 1, 3(a), 3(b), and Rules on Statistics – Certificates of Origin, document [ICC-102-9](#) describe the reporting requirements for exporting Members of the ICO.

Preliminary monthly exports

2. Paragraph 3(a) of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#)) states that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization, not later than **30 days** after the close of each month, information on the total exports in the previous month. If final figures are not available, provisional figures or estimates may be provided.

3. Annex 1 reports on the compliance with paragraph 3(a) for coffee years 2010/11 to 2016/17 and October-December 2017. It contains the number of months in which preliminary totals of exports were submitted for each year. A '0' indicates that no monthly data was submitted within the stipulated time limit for that year while any number up to '12' indicates the number of times that the country provided the required data within the stipulated time limit.

Monthly Reports on exports

4. Exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization, not later than **60 days** after the close of each month, information on the volume and value of exports by form of coffee and by country of destination for the month under report. This information should be based on the relevant Certificates of Origin issued to cover coffee shipped during the period under report and should comply with the format specified in Annex I-B of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#).

5. Annex 2 shows exporting Members' compliance with submission of their monthly statistical reports for coffee years 2010/11 to 2016/17 and October-December 2017. A blank denotes that all reports were submitted during that coffee year. Otherwise the month in which the last report was received for that coffee year is indicated.

Certificates of Origin

6. Paragraph 5 of Rule 4 of the Rules on Statistics – Certificates of Origin, document [ICC-102-9](#) states that exporting Members are requested to transmit data in electronic files or

to forward the first copy of each Certificate of Origin together with a copy of the relevant Bill of Lading to the Organization. In coffee year 2016/17, 81.2% of world exports have been based on data received through Certificates of Origin¹.

7. The volume of exports from exporting Members from whom no Certificates of Origin have been received by the Organization amount to 18.8% of the total volume exported in coffee year 2016/17. As established in paragraph 4 of Article 33 of the International Coffee Agreement (ICA) 2007, exporting Members that opt to issue an alternative document are required to send electronic data or the equivalent document they issue as a replacement to the ICO Certificate of Origin.

8. Annex 3 shows exporting Members' compliance with submission of monthly certificates of origin data for coffee years 2010/11 to 2016/17 and October-December 2017. A blank denotes that data were submitted during that coffee year. If data was only submitted for part of the year, the last month in which data was provided is shown.

Monthly prices paid to growers

9. Paragraph 1(a) of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) states that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization information on the average price received by growers for their produce or the minimum price, if any, guaranteed by the Government to the growers on a monthly basis.

10. Annex 4 shows exporting Members' compliance with submission of monthly prices paid to growers for coffee years 2010/11 to 2016/17 and October-December 2017. A blank denotes that all reports were submitted during that coffee year. If data was only submitted for part of the year, the last month in which data was provided will be shown.

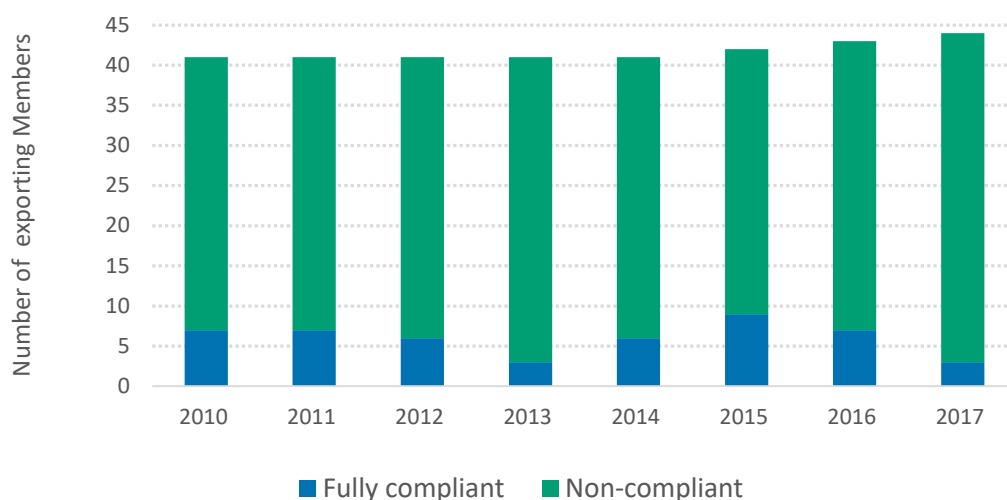
Annual data on opening stocks, production and internal consumption

11. Paragraph 1(b) and (c) of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) state that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization estimates of total production and domestic consumption for the current crop year and the following crop year and closing stocks at the end of each crop year. Those exporting Members producing/exporting more than one type of coffee or using different processing methods (dry or wet) are also requested to indicate, in percentage terms, the type and method of processing.

¹ Data received from some exporting Members are believed to be partial.

12. Annex 5 shows exporting Members' compliance with submission of the three data series for crop years 2010/11 to 2017/18. A blank indicates that all three items were submitted while footnotes detail where only part of the three items were submitted for the whole crop year.

Compliance with providing estimates of stocks, production and domestic consumption



13. Timely provision of opening stocks, production and internal consumption estimates by most producing countries continues to be unsatisfactory. **Only 7 of the 44 exporting Members have fully met their obligations for crop year 2016/17.** A further 5 exporting Members have partially complied with these requirements.

14. Paragraph 1(a) and (c) of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) include four new data series that were not previously required to be reported by exporting Members and came into effect from February 2011.

Report on imports

15. Paragraph 1(a) (iii) of the Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) states that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization **monthly** information on the **volume and value of imports** of coffee, if any, by form (and type, where applicable) by country of origin. This information can be provided according to the relevant Harmonized System (HS) codes by product. Where monthly information is not available, annual data should be provided within **60 days** after the end of each calendar year.

Monthly retail prices

16. Paragraph 1(a) (iv) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization information on the representative retail market prices for roasted and/or soluble coffee for the month under report.

Crop percentage distribution

17. Paragraph 1(c) (i) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that exporting Members are requested to send information on the crop percentage distribution by quarter on an annual basis.

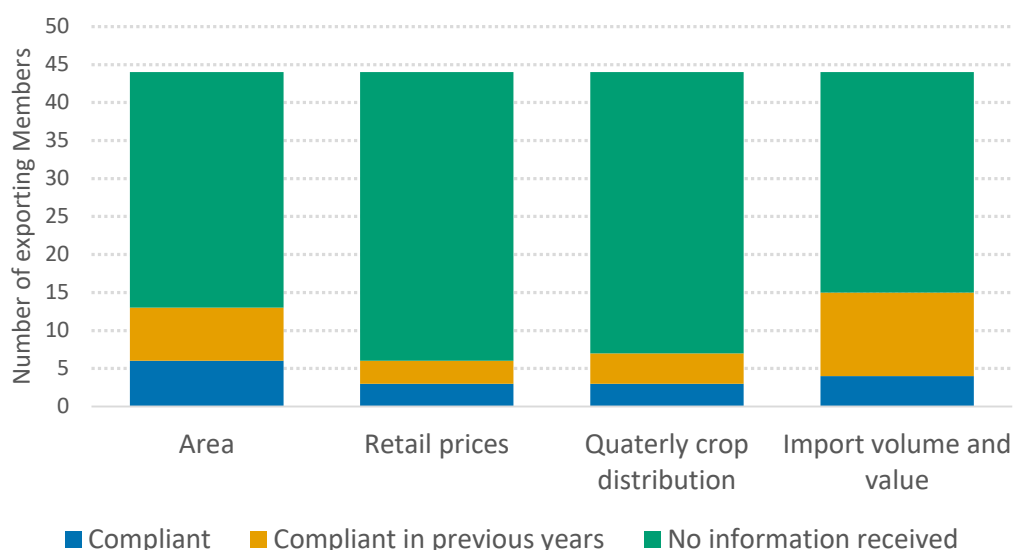
Area under coffee

18. Paragraph 1(c) (iii) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that exporting Members are requested to send to the Organization, on an annual basis, information on the area under coffee – number of trees with respective area in production and number of new trees (not yet in production) and respective area.

19. Annex 12 contains details on exporting Members' compliance with providing the information described in paragraphs 13 to 16 above (report on imports, monthly retail prices, area under coffee, and percentage distribution of production by quarter in each crop year since 2010/11).

20. It should be noted that since the Rules came into effect from February 2011 with a grace period of one year, very few exporting Members have complied with the requests outlined in paragraphs 13 to 16 above. Annex 12 shows the compliance by exporting Members in the provision of the additional statistical information that is required following the entry into force of the ICA 2007. If the exporting Member country is not in compliance the last month in which data was provided is shown.

Statistics provided by importing Members

21. The Rules on Statistics – Statistical Reports, document [ICC-102-10](#) paragraphs 2 and 3(c), describes the reporting requirements for importing Members of the ICO.

Monthly Reports on imports and re-exports

22. Paragraph 3 (c) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that importing Members are requested to send complete reports to the Organization by email or fax, not later than **60 days** after the close of each month, information on the volume and value of imports by form of coffee and by country of origin and on the volume and value of re-exports by form of coffee and by country of destination for the month under report. Statistical information published by Eurostat has been used for European Union data from January 2014.

23. Annex 6 shows that, **all importing Members have submitted monthly reports** through December 2017, which is denoted by a blank. Tunisia provided annual data on their coffee trade up to calendar year 2014.

Monthly retail prices

24. Paragraph 2(a) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that importing Members are requested to send to the Organization information on the representative retail market prices for roasted and/or soluble coffee for the month under report.

25. Annex 7 contains the full details on the provision of monthly retail prices by importing Members. A number of importing Members have informed the Organization that they were unable to comply with the provision of data on retail prices. The reasons provided were that the information was deemed to be confidential, the series did not reflect purchases by consumers or the data were no longer collected. The table below shows the current situation on retail prices.

26. The remaining importing Members provide the information regularly.

Information on roastings

27. Paragraph 2(b) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that importing Members are requested to send to the Organization information on the amount of green coffee that has been roasted at the end of each quarter/calendar year, if available.

28. Annex 8 contains details on the provision of information on roastings. This information is not available in several members of the European Union, Japan, Norway, Tunisia, and the USA. The remaining importing Members provide the information regularly.

Information on inventories

29. Paragraph 2 (b) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that importing Members are requested to send to the Organization information on the stocks of green coffee held by importers and roasters on the last day of the quarter or calendar year, if this information is available.

30. Annex 9 shows compliance with the provision of information on inventories. This information is not available in several members of the European Union, Norway, the Russian Federation, and Tunisia. The remaining importing Members provide the information regularly.

Statistics provided by all Members

31. Paragraphs 1(d) and 2(c) of document [ICC-102-10](#) states that **all Members** are requested to send to the Organization information on changes or revisions in the current level of taxes and duties on coffee exports/imports, or to the laws and regulations of coffee exports/imports in the country.

Exporting and importing Members' compliance summaries

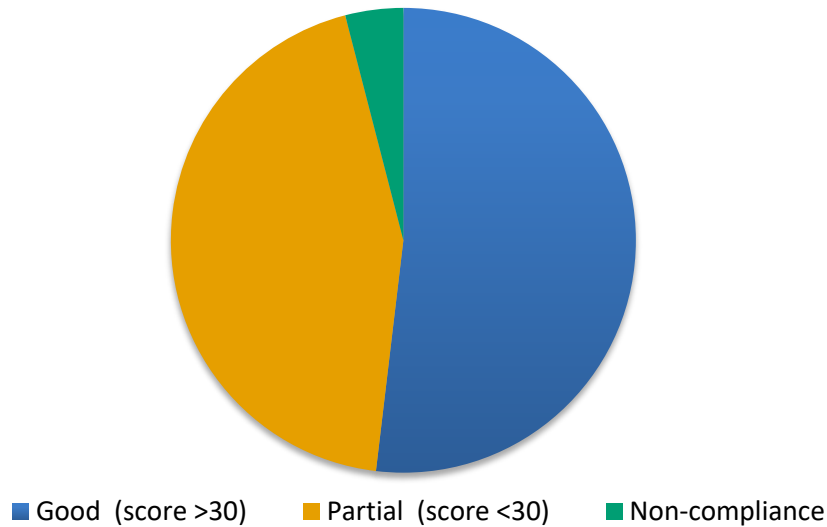
32. There are two summary tables for exporting Members. Annex 10 shows the strict compliance of exporting Members with the Organization's statistical requirements in coffee year 2016/17. Strict compliance means not only sending the required data, but that the data were sent within the time limits prescribed in the Rules. Annex 10a shows the data received from exporting Members in coffee year 2016/17 as at 15 March 2018. Both tables also include the average exports of each country over the last four coffee years and the percentage of each country in the world total.

33. There is a maximum score of 55, which is the number of items to be submitted to the ICO by exporting Members within one coffee year. Twelve points each are awarded for provisional exports, statistical reports, certificates of origin and price to growers, which are to be submitted monthly, with one point for each month data was submitted. A maximum of 3 points, or 1 each, is allocated for opening stocks, production and domestic consumption. Lastly, there are 4 items worth one point each under 'new data'. These are the items that were added in the 2007 agreement and came into effect in February 2011. Annex 12 provides details on compliance with providing data on area under coffee, retail prices of roasted coffee, quarterly crop distribution, and import data.

34. Compliance is considered to be generally full when exporting Members submit at least 45 of the 55 items required. A score of less than 45, but greater than or equal to 30 is considered good compliance while partial compliance is a score of between 11 and 30. Poor compliance is indicated by a score of 10 or less while exporting Members who did not submit any records at all are considered non-compliant.

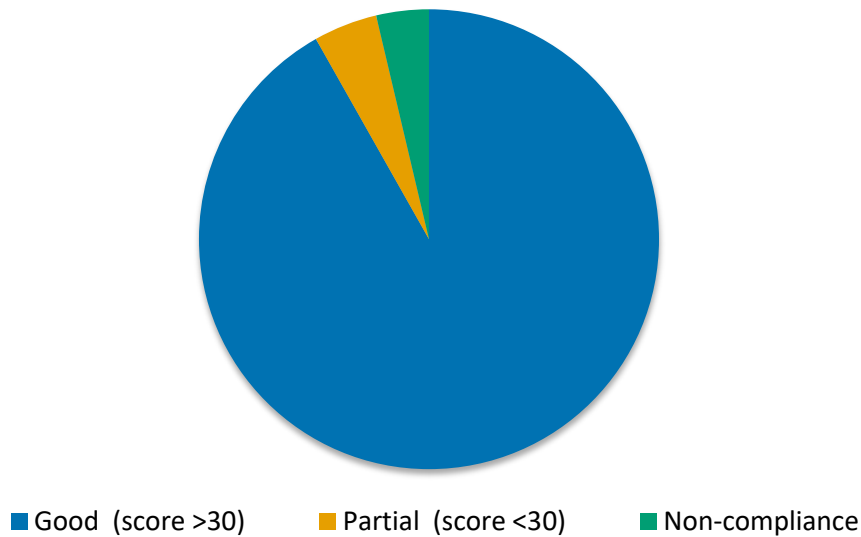
35. Annex 10 shows that, in terms of both number of items and timeliness, only 2 (representing 5.1%) out of 44 exporting Members in the current membership of the Agreement generally complied fully, while 9 (46.7%) had good compliance. A further 4 countries (15.2%) had partial compliance. 10 Members (28.8%) had poor compliance while 19 Members (4%) did not submit any records within the time limit prescribed by the Rules. Finally, exports by 7 producing non-member countries, who were former Members under the ICA 2001, represent 0.2% of the average total exports in the last four coffee years.

Exporting Member Strict Compliance



36. Annex 10A shows the data received from exporting Members in coffee year 2016/17 as at 16 March 2018. It includes data received in compliance with the Statistical Rules, as well as data received outside the dates stipulated in these Rules. In this analysis out of 44 exporting Members in the current membership of the Agreement, 9 exporting Members (representing 51.6%) generally complied fully, while another 12 exporting Members (40.1%) had good compliance. One further country (0.3%) had partial compliance.

Exporting Member Compliance



37. Annex 10a also shows that 17 exporting Members failed entirely to comply with their statistical obligations representing 3.7% of average exports over the last four coffee years

even when allowing for submission of data past the time limits stipulated by the Rules. In addition to these, another 5 exporting Members, accounting for just 4.2% of the exports in the period under consideration, had poor compliance.

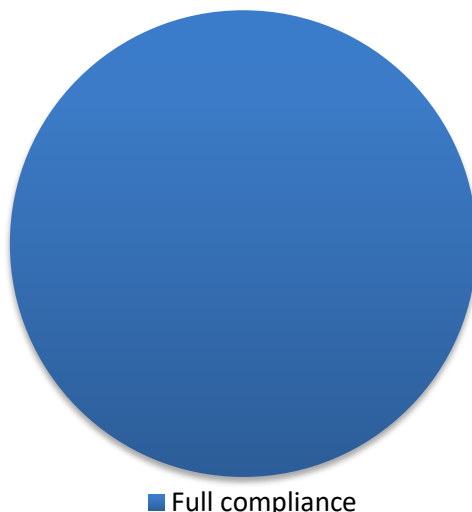
38. As reported above, exports by 7 producing non-member countries, who were former Members under the ICA 2001, represent 0.2% of the average total exports in the last four coffee years. Two of these non-members still regularly send data to the Secretariat.

39. In summary, for coffee year 2016/17, there are 22 exporting Members with generally full, good or part compliance in Annex 10a who represent 92% of average exports in the last four coffee years. This compares to 15 exporting Members (67%) in Annex 10. The same comparison for exporting Members who either fail entirely to comply with their statistical obligations or who have poor compliance is 22 exporting Members (7.9%) in Annex 10A compared to 29 exporting Members (32.8%) in Annex 10.

40. Since the previous Report on Compliance in September 2017, the Secretariat has once again written to all exporting Member countries and requested all missing data. It can be seen from this Report that compliance with the provision of statistical data has been maintained since September 2017. However, the percentage of exporting Members who either fail entirely to comply with their statistical obligations or who have poor compliance was markedly smaller in Annex 10a of this report (7.9%) compared to the percentage share published in the previous Compliance Report in September 2017 (27.9%) when data submitted outside the time limits is included.

41. Annex 11 shows full compliance by 34 importing Members representing 100% of average annual imports by all importing Members in the four coffee years 2013/14 to 2016/17. Annual data on Tunisia's coffee trade was provided up to calendar year 2014. The average volume of imports for importing Members for coffee years 2013/14 through 2016/17 was 73.08 million bags, which accounts for 79.59% of the average annual volume of coffee trade.

Importing Member Compliance



Recommendations

42. Members should be made aware that statistical information is essential for the reliability of the reports and for the accuracy of the supply/demand analysis released by the Organization.

43. The Rules on Statistics contained in documents [ICC-102-9](#) and [ICC-102-10](#), Certificates of Origin and Statistical Reports, respectively, have now been in effect for seven years. Members that encounter difficulties in implementing these Rules in their countries are invited to contact the Secretariat with a view to seeking guidance on how timely reports and data can be prepared in accordance with the requirements specified.

44. As part of the implementation of the ICO Five-Year Action Plan, the Organization will be strengthening its capacity-building function through:

- (a) Training workshops to assist Members in the preparation of Monthly and Quarterly Reports.
- (b) Making available a video guide on the compilation of Statistical Reports on the ICO website or from the Secretariat.
- (c) Setting up a reward and loyalty/certification scheme for Members' Statistical focal points to foster their active participation in the ICO statistical function.
